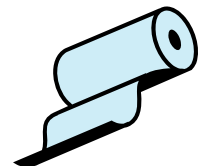
Paint the Barrels!

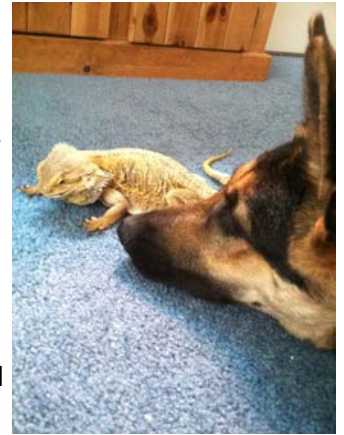


Caring Canines
