


Steps you can take to help **PREVENT STORMWATER POLLUTION!**

✔ Learn about Integrated Pest Management (IPM) and minimize use of pesticides.



✔ Make sure your septic is clean and working properly.



✔ Make sure your car is not leaking fluids and recycle used motor oil.



✔ Compost yard waste, grass clippings, and leaves.



✔ Direct downspouts onto lawns and away from paved areas.



✔ Follow instructions for fertilizers; sweep sidewalks and driveways after application.



✔ Pick up your pet's solid waste; don't allow it to go into storm drains.



✔ Never pour any waste, yard materials, or **ANYTHING** into storm drains.



✔ Wash your car on the lawn or visit a car wash.

NONPOINT SOURCE POLLUTION

Our waterways and groundwater are being polluted on a daily basis. The largest contributor to this pollution is stormwater runoff. This is called **non-point source pollution (NSP)**, meaning it doesn't come from a distinct source like a power plant or a factory.

The Clean Water Act was established to help rectify those problems. Phase 2 of the Act calls for state, county and local governments to address NSP.

Did you know that storm drains enter directly into our waterways? They do not go to



a treatment facility, therefore *all the trash and chemicals that get picked up by rain and pulled into the storm drains enter our waterways.*


