AGING GRANT-FUNDED PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES (APS) (609) 518-4793 Services to safeguard a vulnerable adult's rights/resources to protect them from abuse/neglect/exploitation. APS screens and investigates reports of possible abuse/neglect/exploitation. APS identifies and arranges for services to assist vulnerable adults. Provided by Burlington County Board of Social Services.

ASSESSMENT/OPTIONS COUNSELING (609) 265-5069 Intake Social Worker will complete an assessment that will determine the most appropriate services for the individual and identify those most at risk of nursing home placement.

CONGREGATE NUTRITION (609) 702-7053 Aging office provides nutritious meals which meet the one-third dietary reference intake to residents age 60 and over at congregate nutrition sites. Recreational/social activities and informational/health-related programs are available at the congregate sites.

HOMEMAKER/HOME HEALTH AIDE SERVICES/RESPIRE (609) 265-5069 Support is provided to the client for personal care activities and light household tasks related to maintaining health and allowing client to remain in their home. Provides respite for the caregiver. **

HOME DELIVERED NUTRITION (609) 702-7053 Aging office delivers a nutritious meal to the resident's home which meets one-third of dietary reference intake. Clients of the program must be age 60 and over, home-bound and unable to prepare their own meals.

INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE (609) 265-5069 Aging staff provide information and links residents to services, programs and opportunities available in the community.

MONEY MANAGEMENT (609) 894-9311 X 1358 Provides guidance and non-intrusive bill paying assistance to maximize bill-paying capacity. Volunteers assist in budgeting, the processing of routine bills, check writing, managing financial matters and/or reconciling bank accounts. Services are provided by the Retired and Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) at Rowan College at Burlington County. **

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY/SENIOR FITNESS (609) 543-6200 Planned and structured activities aimed at improving or maintaining physical health of residents age 60 and over. Aging office grant funds the evidence based *Arthritis Foundation Aquatic Program* provided by the YMCA which promotes the overall wellness of the client. Please call and ask for the Aging grant-funded program. **

RESIDENTIAL MAINTENANCE (609) 265-5785 Provides services to residents age 60 and over whose health and safety are threatened and/or at risk of institutional placement. Tasks can include replacing door locks, minor home repairs and housing improvements which may deter crime. Provides information on home improvement repairs, loans and weatherization. Services provided by Burlington County Sheriff's Department. **

SENIOR LEGAL ASSISTANCE (609) 265-5945 Provides legal advice, assistance and/or representation to protect and secure the rights of older persons. Program provided to residents age 60 and over and their spouses. **

SOCIAL DAYCARE/RESPITE (856) 234-5999 Provides a safe, structured, homelike setting where older adults can socialize and participate in activities. Services are provided by The Tender, Inc. to seniors and their caregivers. **

TRANSPORTATION TO CONGREGATE MEALS (609) 702-7053 Transportation is provided, on a limited basis, to participants of the congregate nutrition program. Clients receive transportation from their home to one of three congregate nutrition sites. The program is provided by Aging grant funds and service is provided by Sen-Han Transit.

HEARING--normal structure and function of the auditory system; diseases and disorders of the ear including hereditary and other forms of congenital deafness such as Usher syndrome, sudden deafness, noise-induced hearing loss, ototoxicity, presbycusis, tinnitus, otitis media, otosclerosis, and AIDS-related hearing impairment; hearing aids, cochlear implants, vibrotactile aids, assistive devices, and screening methods.

BALANCE--normal structure and function of the vestibular system; disorders and diseases including Meniere's disease, positional vertigo, vestibular neuronitis, and acoustic neuroma resulting in vertigo, dizziness, and dysequilibrium.

SMELL--normal structure and function of the olfactory system; disorders of smell resulting in anosmia (loss of sense of smell), hyposmia (reduced smell function), and paraosmia (distortion of sense of smell).

NIDCD INFORMATION CLEARINGHOUSE CONTINUES...

TASTE--normal structure and function of the gustatory system; taste disorders resulting in ageusia (loss of sense of taste), hypogeusia (reduced taste function), and dysgeusia (distortion of sense of taste).

VOICE--normal structure and function of the vocal tract; processes of voice production; disorders of the voice such as laryngeal nodules, polyps and neoplasms, contact ulcers, spasmodic dysphonia, vocal tremor, and vocal fold paralysis resulting in hoarseness and weakness of the voice.

“Assisted Living Residence” (ALR) means a facility which is licensed by the Department of Health & Senior Services to provide apartment-style housing and congregate dining and to assure that assisted living services are available when needed, for four or more adult persons unrelated to the proprietor. Apartment units offer, at a minimum, one unfurnished room, a private bathroom, a kitchenette, and a lockable door on the unit entrance.

“Comprehensive Personal Care Homes” (CPCHs) provide room and board and provide assisted living services when needed. Residential units in CPCHs can house no more than two residents and have a lockable door on the unit entrance. CPCHs are licensed by the Department of Health and Senior Services.

These levels range from independent living to forms of assisted living to intermediate and/or skilled nursing care. There is usually no entrance fee or contractual agreement. Priority to move to another level of care is usually given to residents already living in some part of the facility. Some multi-level facilities are called Homes for the Aged or Full-Service Retirement Communities.

Sheriff's Department

SENIOR & VETERAN SERVICES



Free Home Security Inspections are performed by trained Sheriff's staff to make sure our seniors homes are safe and secure. Free window locks, peep holes, reflective house numbers, smoke & carbon monoxide detectors, security locks and power failure lights are provided when available.

Free Med-Info Packets are provided to seniors to have their complete medical history listed by their family physician. The packet of information is recommended to be placed in the home refrigerator and a program magnet is placed on the frig and sticker on the seniors front door, to alert first responders that this information is available.

Persons-At-Risk Program allows the Burlington County Sheriff's Department to input important emergency information for any senior who may suffer from Alzheimer's, Dementia, Autism or any other disability that may cause them to wander from their home and be unable to return home safely. The information and a photograph provided by the family is entered into the confidential law enforcement records system available to law enforcement & 911 dispatchers.

Project Lifesaver Program provides wristband worn radio transmitters to Persons-At-Risk clients who may wander. The Sheriff's Department is among the 21 Sheriff Depts. in New Jersey who are partners in this valuable program. Should a client be reported missing, the Sheriff or one of our local law enforcement partners in Burlington County will respond with emergency tracking equipment to help the client return home safely.

Senior Police Academy is a 6-week, 1-day per week program that provides seniors with valuable information on crime prevention, consumer fraud, public health issues, fire safety, information on court services and all other senior services provided by the Sheriff's Department. Site visits to the county 9-1-1 center and police range are included in this informational course.

Veteran ID Cards are provided to any military veteran who has been honorably discharged from any branch of the armed forces. Appointments may be scheduled by calling the Sheriff's Department or by going to the county store at the Moorestown Mall the last Wednesday morning of each month.

Defensive Driving Course is a free 6-hour instructional course to help make drivers safer on the roadway. Participants may be eligible to receive up to a 5% discount and/or a 2-point New Jersey Motor Vehicles reduction. A \$10 fee is required for the National Safety Council certificate.



The many duties of the Surrogate's Court include the probating of wills, appointing of estate administrators, supervising the appointment of guardians and administering adoptions. My responsibility as Surrogate is to oversee the administration of the many services offered by this Surrogate's Court. A Will is a legally enforceable written document that takes effect upon death, and directs the distribution of a person's personal property and real estate. 
