

## **Health Terms**

**Age Adjusted Mortality Rate:** A death rate that controls for the effects of differences in population age distributions, a value which indicates the risk of dying relative to a standard population. The AADR is thought to be more efficient than crude death rates for comparing mortality of population groups with different age structures.

**Asymptomatic:** Does not show symptoms

**Binge Drinking:** 4 or more drinks in one occasion for women and 5 or more drinks in one occasion for men

**Ectopic Pregnancy:** a pregnancy in which the fetus develops outside of the uterus, can be fatal to both the mother and fetus

**Health Disparities:** “a health outcome [which] is seen to a greater or lesser extent between populations” Healthy People 2020

**Heavy Drinking:** 8 or more drinks per week for women and 15 or more drinks per week for men

**Incidence:** the number of **new cases** of a specific disease occurring during a certain period in a population at risk

**Morbidity:** 1) how often a disease occurs in a population 2) the condition of being diseased

**Mortality:** 1) the number of deaths in a given time or place 2) the proportion of deaths to a population

**Nutrient Dense Foods:** foods which have a lot of nutrients (carbohydrates, proteins, lipids, vitamins, and minerals)

**Prevalence:** the number of people in a given population who have a specific disease at any given time

**Risk Factors:** something that increases a person’s chances of getting a disease
