**WARRANTS SERVED ON 47 DELINQUENT PARENTS  
DURING THREE-DAY CHILD SUPPORT SWEEP**

**Burlington County Sheriff Tallies The Total Owed At \$791,842**

Sheriff Jean Stanfield announced that her department, in cooperation with law enforcement agencies both within and outside the County, last week served warrants on 47 non-custodial parents who have failed to pay their court-ordered child support.

The arrests took place during a three-day child support sweep across the State that ended on Thursday. Stanfield said that in Burlington County \$15,459 was collected out of \$791,842 owed in delinquent child support payments.

"This was a well-organized, cooperative effort by sheriffs in all 21 counties to round up delinquent non-custodial parents," said Stanfield. "Enforcing child support orders sends a clear message that the needs of our children must be met.

"At the end of the day this is an issue for all taxpayers," she added. "When child support goes unpaid, the cost of care often falls on State and County social service and other agencies."

A total 965 warrants were served statewide, on parents owing nearly \$13.7 million, according to the Sheriff's Association of New Jersey. A total \$267,883 was collected.
