SHERIFF TO HOLD SAFETY DAY AT MOORESTOWN MALL THIS SATURDAY

Free Child Safety Seat Checks and Document Shredding To Be Offered

This Saturday, September 4, 2010, the Burlington County Sheriff's Department will be holding a "Safety Day" at Moorestown Mall from 10 AM to 2 PM. The free event will include child safety seat checks by certified Child Safety Seat Technicians, free child fingerprinting and free document shredding.

The event will be held on the Route 38 side of the Mall in front of Boscov's Department Store.

"For families who are staying close to home this Labor Day weekend or planning to walk the mall, this is an easy opportunity to get rid of some unneeded personal papers, have someone check the installation of your child's car seat, and pick up some valuable information on safety issues to follow around and close to home," said Sheriff Jean Stanfield.

Information will also be available on free senior citizen programs, defensive driving classes, and the CERT (Community Emergency Response Team). CERT is the County's citizen volunteer corps which is trained to assist first responders in times of emergency.

Stanfield encouraged parents of young children to take advantage of the child safety seat program. Since the program was initiated 11 years ago the Sheriff's Department has inspected nearly 10,000 seats; less than 12 percent were installed correctly.

Document shredding is being offered as a safeguard against identity theft. Families and individuals can bring boxes of documents that will be shredded on site to help prevent personal identifiers from falling into the wrong hands.
