The Sheriff's Office provides the free residential maintenance program. Additional free services include the free medication information packets, person-at-risk program, AngelSense, the senior police academy, defensive driving program, and senior photo identification cards. A speaker from the Sheriff's office is available for community and senior site events.

New Jersey Fresh Produce for Burlington County Senior Citizens

Burlington County Board of County Commissioners and the Office On Aging work with the NJ Senior Farmers' Market Nutrition Program to provide our residents with vouchers to buy locally grown produce. Residents at least 60 years old, who live in Burlington County, and are income eligible, are able to receive vouchers to purchase locally grown fruits, vegetables, and herbs from our local farmers' markets. Proof of residency, age, and income are required. Vouchers are distributed according to program availability if found eligible. Contact the Burlington County Aging & Disability Resource Connection (ADRC) at 609-265-5069 or 877-222-3737. The Program is available June to September of each year and is subject to funding.

GRANT-FUNDED PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

ADULT PROTECTIVE SERVICES 609-518-4793 Burlington County Board of Social Services receives and investigates reports of suspected abuse, neglect, and exploitation of vulnerable adults.

A vulnerable adult is over 18 years of age, lives in the community, and has a physical or mental disability that causes impairments to their abilities to make decisions or properly communicate in regards to their own safety or well-being. This individual is the subject of abuse, neglect, or exploitation.

ASSESSMENT/OPTIONS COUNSELING 609-265-5069 OOA/ADRC staff completes the Screen for Community Services (SCS) that determines the most appropriate services for the individual and identifies those most at risk of nursing home placement. Referrals are made to appropriate agencies.

ASSISTIVE TECHNOLOGY 267-350-8611 JEVS Human Services agency provides this program to aid individuals aged 60 years and older to help maintain independence, reduce social isolation, enable socialization, and help perform activities that might otherwise be difficult or impossible.

CAREGIVER HOUSEKEEPING SERVICE 609-747-7745 Resources for Independent Living provides housekeeping services for seniors and their caregivers. This service provides routine basic upkeep and management of homes. It enables older persons and their caregivers to remain in their home by removing housekeeping barriers.

HOME DELIVERED NUTRITION/MEALS ON WHEELS 609-702-7053 OOA/ADRC The Meals on Wheels program provides a nutritious well-balanced meal for homebound county residents. Clients must be age 60 and over, physically unable to cook for themselves, and have no available support.

HOME HEALTH CARE SERVICES 609-265-5069 OOA/ADRC provides homemaker, home health aide, and respite care services. Those over 60 years of age with the greatest social and economic need are prioritized. Respite care provides support and relief for the caregiver.

INFORMATION AND ASSISTANCE 609-265-5069 OOA/ADRC Information and Assistance staff provide referrals, information, and link residents to resources or programs available in the community.

OUTREACH/PUBLIC AWARENESS 609-265-5069 OOA/ADRC staff provide presentations and public awareness events throughout the county. Staff are available for informational tables at community events and senior sites. The program promotes awareness of the services and information available within the community.

PHYSICAL ACTIVITY/SENIOR FITNESS 856-231-9622 Mt. Laurel YMCA provides memberships to seniors 60 years of age and over with the greatest social and economic need.

RESIDENTIAL MAINTENANCE AND ANGELSENSE 609-265-5785 Sheriff's Department's The Home Modification program serves residents age 60 and over; new door locks, minor home repairs, and housing improvements are provided which may deter crime.

AngelSense is a tracking device which uses a GPS system that connects with a smart phone application. It can be worn by an individual for safety during wandering.

SENIOR LEGAL ASSISTANCE 800-496-4570 South Jersey Legal Services provides legal advice, assistance, and/or representation to protect and secure the rights of older persons aged 60 and over and their spouses.

SENIOR NUTRITION SITES 609-702-7053 OOA/ADRC offers fun, fellowship, and enrichment for those 60 years and older and their spouses. Enjoy a hot lunch and join a variety of activities. There are four locations—Beverly, Bordentown, Mt. Holly, and Moorestown.

SOCIAL DAYCARE/RESPIRE 856-234-5999 The Tender, Inc. provides a safe, structured, homelike setting where older adults can socialize and participate in activities. Allows the caregiver a needed break from caregiving.

TRANSPORTATION TO SENIOR NUTRITION SITES 609-702-7053 Sen-Han Transit offers transportation, on a limited basis, to participants of the Senior Nutrition Sites congregate nutrition program. Clients receive transportation from their home to one of the congregate nutrition sites.
